Treatment approaches for esophageal dysphagia may include: Esophageal dilation. For a tight esophageal sphincter (achalasia) or an esophageal stricture, your doctor may use an endoscope with a special balloon attached to gently stretch and expand the width of your esophagus or pass a flexible tube or tubes to stretch the esophagus (dilation).

Treatment for oropharyngeal causes of dysphagia Since oropharyngeal dysphagia is a problem with how your throat muscles move, your physician may refer you for swallowing therapy where you can learn different exercises and techniques to better coordinate your swallowing and stimulate the nerves that trigger swallowing.

Empirical treatment for patients without typical symptoms or objective evidence of GERD thus cannot be routinely recommended. The historic recommendation is to treat patients with higher dose PPI (twice daily) than patients with typical GERD symptoms; however, this is based on uncontrolled and observational data only ( 143 , 144 ).
