Braking training takes 700 hours to complete. (In a 160 hr work month it takes about 5 months). Locomotive engineers receive certification accredited by the Federal Railroad Administration upon finishing training programs and passing the tests. Written exams focus on train operating procedures and features of surrounding territories that may affect a train in motion, such as steep mountains or icy areas.
